D1.1 Report on establishment and first conference call of Management Board Date: 22/12/2015

Abstract

The Global BioImaging project's decision-making body is its Management Board, comprising the H2020 Beneficiaries together with their Australian and Indian partners. During the first month of project life, the Management Board has been established and its kick-off conference call successfully conducted. As a consequence an agreement has been reached on the first project's activities to be implemented.

The present report constitutes the deliverable D1.1 of the Global Biolmaging project.

1. Introduction

The Global Biolmaging project brings together Euro-Biolmaging with imaging infrastructure

experts from Australia, Argentina, South Africa, India, Japan and the United States of

America to open provision of imaging and training services to biological and medical

researchers and imaging facility staff world-wide. It has the ambitious goal of creating a

global network of state-of-the-art imaging research infrastructures which will operate

interconnected, by pursuing collaboration agreements on the reciprocal use, openness and

co-financing of their services.

The Management Board is the project's strategic decision-making body and is responsible

for project planning, ensuring that the focus on the project's objectives is maintained as well

as validating milestones and deliverables. It comprises the seven H2020 Beneficiaries, which

represent Euro-Biolmaging, together with the Australian and Indian partners, which have

signed collaboration agreements with Euro-BioImaging and support major project's

activities such as hosting of workshops and training courses.

The Management Board will physically meet back-to-back with the annual workshops

organized within Work Package 2 and have three-monthly conference calls for discussing

and deciding on all relevant project management items.

2. Description of Task 1.1

The management of the Global BioImaging project is established within Work Package 1 (WP1) and includes the formation of the Management Board.

The Project Manager, in agreement with the Project Coordinator and having sought the availability of all the members of the Management Board (MB), has organized the first MB conference call for the 8th of December 2015.

The call's objectives were:

- To form the management team and kick-off the project;
- To review the project's objectives and scope;
- To identify the major activities for the first six months of the project.

The conference call took place with the active participation of all members of the Management Board with the exception of the representatives from the Erasmus Universitair Medisch Centrum Rotterdam, which were excused and duly informed about the conclusions of the meeting.

After a brief welcome session all participants introduced themselves by outlining their relevant present and past experience and their role within the project. The Global BioImaging project's scope and objectives were then illustrated by the Project Coordinator. Subsequently each Work Package (WP) leader briefly described her/his WP and identified the first planned activities, the risks and challenges associated to their implementation and the interaction with the other WPs. This lead to the identification of the major upcoming tasks for the first six months of project's life and to the identification of the first planned actions aimed at their implementation.

D1.1 Report on establishment and first conference call of Management Board Date: 22/12/2015

<u>Item 1 - Welcome, Introduction and Meeting opening (presentation slides 1-6)</u>

Project Coordinator Antje Keppler

Antje welcomes the meeting's participants, representing the Management Board (MB) members with the exception of Erasmus MC.

She introduces the meeting and outlines the Global BioImaging (GBI) project: its vision of promoting collaboration between Euro-BioImaging (EuBI) and international partners in the field of open access Imaging Infrastructures operation. Antje points out that in summer 2015 the project was awarded a grant from the European Commission (EC) in the framework of the Horizon 2020 (H2020) Program. The Grant Agreement (GA) kicked off on the 1^{st} of December 2015 and will finance the project's activities for the coming 3 years and for a total of $1.78M \in$.

After having outlined the role of the MB within the project, Antje gives the word to each of the participants for a brief introduction.

<u>Item 2 – "Tour de Table" – Presentation of participants (presentation slides 7-19)</u>

All participants

With the aid of a slide, each participant introduces her/himself by indicating the organization they represent, their role within both the organization and the GBI project and their relevant past experience. For more details please refer to presentation slides (attached).

<u>Item 3 - Overview on project's Scope and Objectives (presentation slides 20-24)</u>

Project Coordinator Antje Keppler

Antje outlines the GBI Scope and Objectives, starting from describing the main GBI activities, which consist of:

- The organisation of 3 "Exchange of Experience" (EoE) workshops, in the summer of 2016, 2017 and 2018:
 - The organization of EoE I has already been started and the workshop will take place between 8th-10th June 2016 at the EMBL in Heidelberg;
 - EoE II will take place in Bangalore (India) and it has been proposed that it will be organised back-to-back with the annual Bangalore Microscopy Conference;
 - EoE III will take place in Sidney (Australia) and it has been proposed that it will be organised back-to-back with the International Microscopy Congress (IMC19).
- The organisation of 2 international training workshops aiming at training facility staff on open access infrastructure operations.
- The organisation of 2 international training workshops on image data analysis for facility staff, image data analysts and software tool developers.

- The organization of 3 rounds of shadowing programs in 2016, 2017 and 2018 where European and international operational facility staff will visit selected Nodes and Imaging Facilities to exchange best practices on Imaging Infrastructures operations;
- The development, testing and publication of a virtual platform for training material and a common virtual repository of software tools for image data analysis;
- The establishment of a sustainable collaboration between European and international partners, both through existing collaborations and the outreach to other regions.

Antje highlights how the GBI project is closely interlinked with Euro-BioImaging, not only with regards to its Interim Phase and the EC H2020 Preparatory Phase II grant, but also in terms of the stakeholders.

Item 4 - Brief description of WPs, first activities, Risk & Challenges, Interactions amongst WPs (presentation slides 25-33)

Federica Paina (Antje Keppler, Jan Ellenberg), John Eriksson (Inga Pukonen, Pasi Kankaanpää), Rainer Pepperkok (Silvio Aime, Jean Salamero, Graça Raposo), Gabriella Rustici on behalf of Jason Swedlow (Rainer Pepperkok, Federica Paina, Jean Salamero, Graça Raposo, Wiro Niessen, Aad Van Der Lugt, Julien Colombelli), Silvio Aime (Alessandra Viale, Enzo Terreno, Simonetta Geninatti, John Eriksson), Antje Keppler on behalf of Tanja Ninkovic (Federica Paina)

Federica introduces item 4 by explaining how the major activities outlined by Antje in item 3 are structured into the EC H2020 grant and invites each WP leader to briefly describe her/his own activities for the first 6 months, the associated risks and challenges and the interactions with the other WPs (see slides).

The section below outlines:

- the main remarks made by the call participants and that are not reported as text in the
- the next actions to be undertaken.

WP1 Project Management

Federica invites the MB members and the WP leaders to seek her support in case of need.

Planned action 1: Federica to set-up a doodle to decide the dates and times of the 2016 MB conference calls (March, September and December 2016). The June MB meeting will be a physical meeting, taking place on the occasion of the EoE I workshop.

Planned action 2: Federica to work on the GBI website (currently hosted by www.eurobioimaging.eu) by adding more pages to the existing introductory page.

WP2 Exchange of Experience - Operating Open Access Imaging Infrastructures

John informs the audience that Janelia Farms (USA) - in the person of Teng-Leong Chew - visited their facilities in Finland and newly expressed their interest in collaborating in the GBI project. Antje

informs that this partner – who had sent a letter of support in 2014, when the application for the EC H2020 grant was submitted – will be contacted before the end of January 2016 (see WP6).

Planned action 3: Inga to progress in the planning of the June 2016 EoE I workshop with the support of Federica and Antje, involved in WP1 and WP6. Particular relevance should be given to the organization of travel grants.

WP3 Training for facility staff and virtual platform for training material

Rainer informs that a new member of staff which will be dedicated to the WP will be hired at EMBL. The presumed starting date will be in January/Fabruary 2016.

Regarding the Risks and Challenges, Rainer stresses the importance of avoiding "reinventing the wheel" and refers to the AMMRF's "MyScope" platform as an excellent example of online training tools. As outlined in the GA the GBI virtual platform should be build starting from "MyScope". He asks Miles if there is a need for new training modules for the latest imaging technologies, which have not been covered yet and could now be taken care of by this WP3. He invites an exchange of information (existing resources, community needs to be met) between EuBI and AMMRF to make the common efforts as complementary as possible.

Miles points out that the virtual platform should be an item of discussion during EoE I. In preparation of this Rainer proposes a teleconference (telco) with Miles in the beginning of 2016.

Planned action 4: Rainer and Miles to organise a telco at the beginning of 2016 with the aim of defining a strategy for the building of the GBI virtual platform in the AMMRF "MyScope".

Planned action 5: Rainer and Gabriella to define the definite date for the workshop in November 2016 asap.

WP4 Image Data – Tools and Training

Gabriella points out the importance of sharing the lessons learnt from other projects (such as Elixir-Excelerate) with GBI and to build synergies with the NEUBIAS project (recently granted COST action CA15124).

Julien Colombelli highlights the complementarity of GBI with NEUBIAS and proposes to organize a physical meeting in Heidelberg in February 2016, on the occasion of the NEUBIAS Management Committee meeting preparation. One important question in the community currently is how to find suitable image data sets for training purposes.

Jan Ellenberg points out that a strong complementarity exists also with the Euro-BioImaging Preparatory Phase II (EuBI PPII) project and proposes to organize a joint meeting on this subject.

Planned action 6: Gabriella, Julien and the EMBL team to organise a joint meeting on the synergies and interaction amongst GBI, NEUBIAS and EuBI PPII in February/March 2016.

WP5 Exchange of People – Shadowing Program for Facility Staff

Silvio indicates that within the shadowing program a single person could visit different facilities. WP5

will establish and run a program for exchange visits of European and international facility operational staff such as laboratory managers or specialist technical officers to other infrastructures sites in Europe, India and Australia.

WP6 Outreach to Other Regions

Antje invites all the meeting participants to inform her in case they will become aware of interested potential partners besides the existing ones (i.e. Argentina, Japan, South Africa, USA – who have already signed letters of support – and Mexico).

The participants indicate as potential candidates Singapore, Chile and Brazil. A meeting per continent to which interested new partners could participate and learn about GBI could be organised.

Jan suggests a terminology to distinguish Australia and India, who have signed collaboration agreements with EuBI, from the other countries: **partner countries** for Australia and India and **associate partner countries** for the others.

Planned action 7: Antje to continue dialogue with Argentina, Japan, South Africa and the USA as well as establishing sustainable contact with Mexico.

<u>Item 5 – Discussion on major upcoming activities (first 6 months)</u> (presentation slides 34-38)

Federica Paina

Federica resumes the to-do-list for the first 6 months by indicating the upcoming activities, which were individually described by each WP leader in the previous session.

A particular session is dedicated to the EoE I, for which the participants' opinion is sought regarding:

- the process leading to the practical organisation of the workshop, in particular the event advertisement and the selection of participants (including the mechanisms for the assignment of the international travel grants);
- the topics to be treated during the workshop.

Jan advices to advertise the workshop very clearly indicating which audience should be targeted.

A brief discussion regarding the content of the workshop follows and suggestions are made regarding the concept of the topics to be covered, as outlined in slide 39.

The main conclusions are the following:

- upon a suggestion by Miles, a session summarizing the the state-of-the-art of EuBI as well as
 the objectives and rationale behind GBI will be included in the agenda. An overview of the
 profiles of the various Research Infrastructures involved in both EuBI and GBI will also be
 added.
- Although one of the main outcomes of EoE I should be the definition of an effective strategy
 for the preparation of the training courses to be delivered within WP3 and WP4, the topics
 of access policy, standardisation and quality control of services to be offered in the Research
 Infrastructures (RI) and EuBI Nodes could be addressed (John).
- Regarding the assignment of the international travel grants, the call should be managed at
 the national levels by each of the partner countries and associated partner countries. The
 aim will be the selection of the best candidates with a background in Imaging Infrastructures
 operations.

Decision 1 – Assignment of international travel grants: Considering the limited number of travel grants available per country outside the Europe, the procedure for the assignment will be managed directly by the partner countries and associated partner countries.

<u>Item 9 – AoB (presentation slide 39)</u>

Antje presents the first draft of Global-Biolmaging logo and asks for feedback to the participants. While the concept of "people holding hands" receives general consensus, agreement is reached regarding the need to review the graphics.

Suggestions are:

- to distinguish each man with a different colour. The 5 colour representing the continents could be used;
- the human chain in the proposed logo could stand and be tilted around the EuBI symbol, like the ring around Saturn (Krishna). This is to attempt a tri-dimensional representation of the circle of people, to make clear from a distance what it represents.

Miles proposes to involve AMMRF's graphic designer in the exercise and all participants agree.

Planned action 8: Miles to involve AMMRF's Multimedia Communication Officer in the design of the GBI logo.


